



REGULATIONS

1. Subject

These Regulations govern the procedures for participation and conduct of the "Tiramisù World Cup 2025" Competition. (hereinafter: "*the Competition*"), in which Competitors shall prepare a "Tiramisu" dessert, according to the Original Recipe or according to a Creative Recipe, which will be submitted to the judgement of special Juries in order to determine the best Tiramisu for each Category, according to the parameters set out in article 7 below.

2. Organiser

The Competition is organised by The Independent Tourism Company S.R.L.s. Unipersonale (hereinafter: "*the Organiser*") in collaboration with public and private partners.

The Organiser is given all decision-making powers in relation to the Competition and its conduct, in compliance with these Regulations, good faith and the constitutional principle of non-discrimination.

3. Stages of the Competition

The Competition starts with the opening of the Registrations and ends with the proclamation of the Tiramisù World Champion for each of the two Categories, and develops in the following stages:

1. Registration, which will be held from the opening until all seats are sold out and in any case no later than 9th October 2025;
2. Selections, which will be held in various places in Italy and abroad, and will end on 11th October 2025;
3. Semifinals, which will be held during the morning of 12th October 2025;
4. Finals, which will be held during the afternoon of 12th October 2025.

4. Admission to participation

Participation in the Tiramisù World Cup is open to all individuals of legal age from any country in the world, with the only exception of professionals in the gastronomy industry.

A "professional in the gastronomy industry" is anyone who currently works, or has worked in the last two years, for at least six months, including non-consecutive months, in a professional kitchen (for example, a restaurant, a hotel), or in a pastry shop. Kitchen or pastry assistants (such as: clerks, waiters, bartenders) are not considered professionals in the gastronomy sector.

In case of disagreement on the actual qualification of the aspiring Competitor, the Organiser will decide on the admission at its own unquestionable and unquestionable judgement.

The qualification as a professional in the catering sector as defined in the second paragraph of this article implies the prohibition to enter the Competition and, in case of registration, the immediate exclusion of the Competitor.

5. Registrations

Only those who will register according to the times and methods indicated on the official website www.tiramisuworldcup.com are admitted to participate in the Competition.

Once registered, the above mentioned subjects will acquire the qualification of "Competitors".

6. Categories

The Competition will be divided into two different Categories, for each of which "*the Tiramisu World Champion*" will be elected:

- Original Recipe category;
- Creative Recipe category.

For the Original Recipe category, Competitors must prepare a tiramisù according to the traditional recipe, and therefore using the six basic ingredients of tiramisù according to the Italian Academy of Cuisine: ladyfingers, mascarpone cheese, eggs, coffee, cocoa, sugar. No variant is allowed. As for eggs, the use of yolk only is compulsory, while the use of egg white is optional.

For the Creative Recipe category, Competitors will have to make tiramisù according to an innovative recipe, even if not their own invention, using six basic ingredients: mascarpone cheese, eggs, coffee, cocoa, while ladyfingers can be replaced with other biscuits or sponge cake and sugar with another sweetener.

These substitutions are not an additional ingredient. Taking care not to distort the essence of the tiramisu, up to a maximum of three other ingredients may be added in this category, at the discretion of the Competitor, who will also be responsible for providing them. In any case, the use of alcohol or alcohol-based ingredients is prohibited. Again, the use of the yolk only is mandatory, while the use of the white is optional. White sugar supplied by the Organiser may be replaced by the Competitor with another type of sweetener, which shall not be considered an additional ingredient within the meaning of this paragraph. 7. Evaluation criteria

The evaluation criteria to be followed by all the Competition Juries are as follows:

- a) technical execution;
- b) dish equilibrium;
- c) aesthetic appearance;
- d) flavour and harmony;
- e) taste intensity.

8. How the Competition is run

The Competition will take place at the locations indicated by the Organiser, where the individual Groups will be set up and the Competitors will be assigned their respective desks within the Groups. The number of the Selection Groups, and consequently of the Semifinalists and Finalists of the Competition, will be determined only after the completion of the Registration stage, according to the number of Competitors admitted to each of the two Categories.

In preparing the Tiramisu, each Competitor may only use the ingredients provided by the Organiser, except as provided for in art. 6 for additional ingredients in the Creative Recipe category.

At the motivated request of the individual Competitor, the Organiser will assess on a case-by-case basis the opportunity to allow the presence of an accompanying person in the competition area of the said Competitor.

Except as provided for in the preceding paragraph, no Competitor may be accompanied or assisted during the Competition, nor shall anyone other than the Competitor be present at each desk.

In order to ensure general safety and in compliance with the regulations in force, each competitor shall adhere to specific behaviour at each stage of participation in the Competition. Instructions will be promptly posted on www.tiramisuworldcup.com.

9. Selections stage

Each Competitor is only entitled to take part in the Selections in the round and in the desk for which he/she registered during registration. For organisational purposes, the Organiser may, at its sole discretion, assign the Competitor to a different desk, without the right for the Competitor to raise objections or disputes.

Each Competitor can register once in each category for each Selection location.

If the Competitor passes the Semifinals in both categories, he/she must choose which category to compete in during the Finals.

During the Selection stage, Competitors will be divided into Groups of a maximum of ten participants competing in the same Category (Original Recipe or Creative Recipe): each Group will be assigned a dedicated Jury.

The Selection Juries will be made up of catering and pastry professionals and/or members of the public and/or others chosen by the Organiser.

Only the Competitor who, as a result of the judging of the panel of Judges, achieves the highest score in his or her group will have access to the semi-finals for the category in which he or she is participating.

In the event that the Competitor registered for more than one location of the Selection stage has already been admitted to the Semifinals, and is first in another round of the Selection stage for the same category, the second classified Competitor will be admitted to the Semifinals for this second round.

10. Semifinals stage

Competitors who win the Selections in accordance with the preceding article will be admitted to the Semifinals in the Category to which they belong. It is not possible to change Category for any reason.

For each of the two Categories, the Competitors will be divided by the Organisers into groups of a maximum of ten semifinalists. The Organiser shall decide on the constitution of the Groups, at their sole and final discretion.

Each Group will be assigned a dedicated Jury, constituted as per art. 9 above.

Only the Competitor who, as a result of the judging of the dedicated Jury, achieves the highest score in his/her group will have access to the Finals for the Category in which he/she is participating.

Admission to the Category Final is subject to the Competitor signing the [contract for the assignment of image rights](#) as prepared by the Organiser. Failure to sign the aforementioned contract will result in the exclusion of the competitor from

the Final, with the subsequent admission of the second best of the various Groups in the category to which the excluded competitor belonged.

If necessary, at its sole and unquestionable discretion, the Organiser may admit one or more Semifinalists to the Final according to specific merit criteria communicated on the website www.tiramisuworldcup.com in good time.

11. Finals stage

Competitors who win the Semifinals in accordance with the preceding article will go on to the Final in the Category to which they belong. It is not possible to change Category for any reason.

Two different Finals will be held simultaneously for each of the two Categories, with a separate Group for each.

The two Final Groups may be judged by a single Jury made up of professionals from the catering and pastry sector, as well as other representatives from the world of culture, tourism and business chosen by the Organiser, who will also indicate the Jury President. The Finalists with the highest score in their Group will be nominated by the President of the Jury:

- World Champion of Tiramisù, for the “Original Recipe” Category Group
- World Champion of Creative Tiramisù, for the “Creative Recipe” Category Group

12. Non-questionability of judgement

The judgement of the Juries is final and unquestionable.
